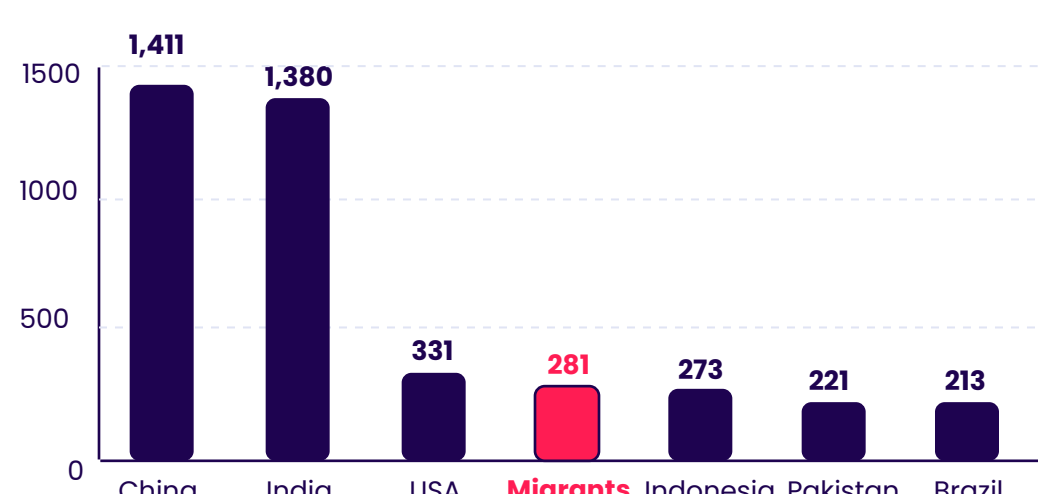


We think it is **important to recognize the value that migrants bring to the world**. Therefore, below is a snapshot with some facts to highlight the sheer size of their transformative power:

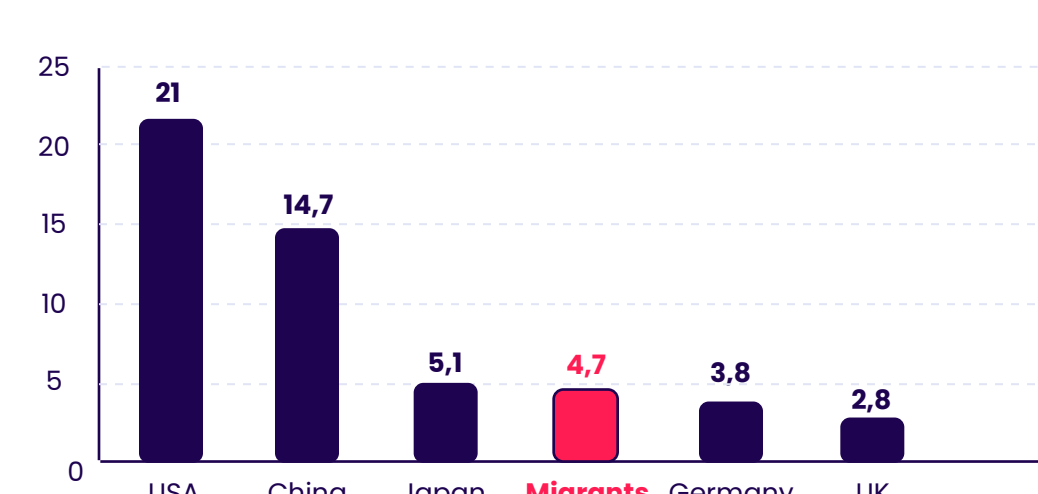
If migrants were a country, this is what it would look like

Population, mm, 2020^{1,2}

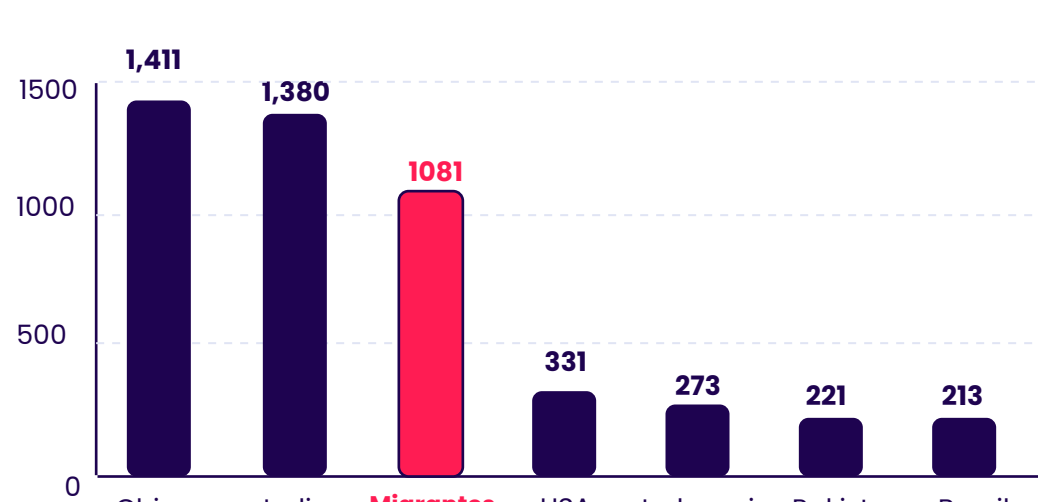


GDP, trillion USD, 2020^{3,4,5}

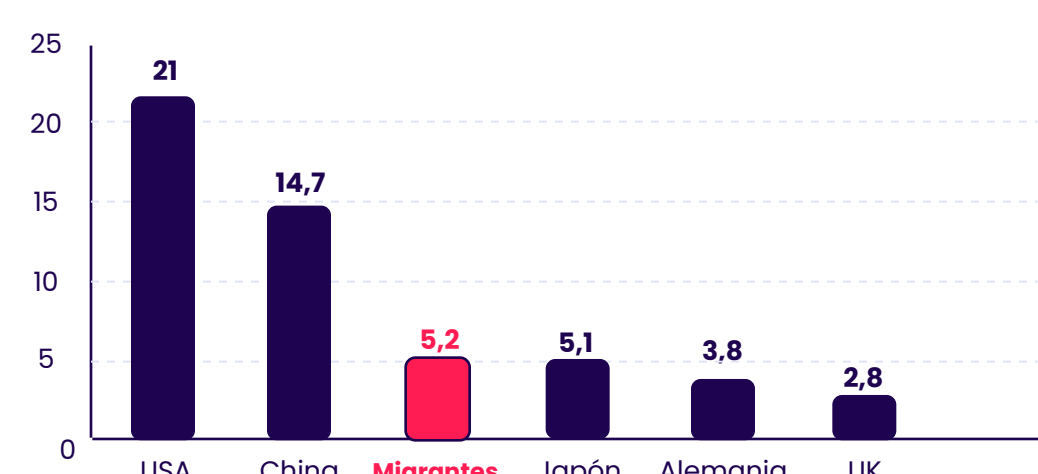


02 If joined by the families they support, they would be the **3rd largest country in the world** in population and size of the economy

PIB, bn USD, 2020



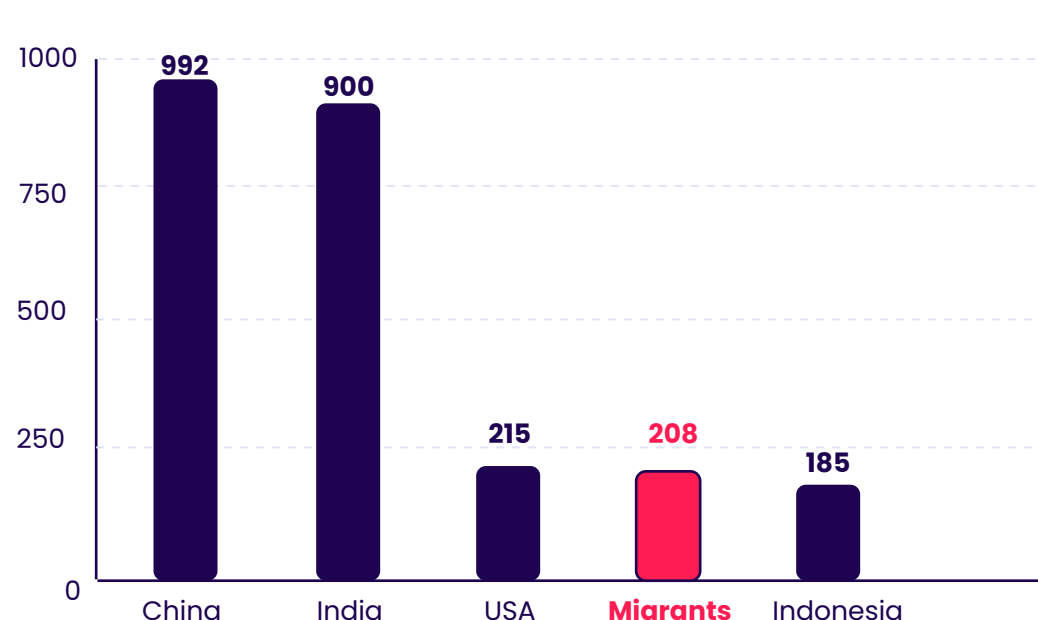
03 They would be the **largest investor AND philanthropist in the world**, twice more than any other country

✓ Around **50%** of global remittances go to rural areas, where **75%** of the world's poor and food insecure live. It is estimated that globally, the accumulated flows to these people will reach **\$1 trillion**⁵.

✓ **11** out of the **17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** contain **targets and indicators relevant to migration**⁹.
